ISCA Entrepreneurs at Home: Chris Clark

Chris Clark studied biology and for a time worked in criminology research and in restaurant management. But she's found her real passion more recently working with young children.

For most of the past decade, Clark has run a licensed childcare program for pre-schoolers in her Indian Spring home. she and her family moved about six years ago into a house at the corner of Franklin and Wire that once was owned and occupied by her husband Tim's great-grandparents.

During the past fall, Clark switched gears to begin running a before-school and after-school program for elementary and middle school students in the neighborhood. She works alone, currently tending to the needs of nine children.

When she opens her summer doors to elementary and middle school children, she expects to offer an array of learning experiences that include sewing, woodworking, berry picking, canning, cooking, nature exploration, participation in Silver Spring events, trips to historic sites and museum visits. "I am excited for the change with the older children, and I am really loving their complex personalities, enthusiasm and boisterous energy," says Clark, who grew up in the Annapolis area and earned a B.A. degree at Towson University.

Clark started her preschooling business when her 3rd daughter was born 10 years ago. "I wanted to be able to provide the childcare setting I could not find anywhere for her and for other children," she says.

As a pre-school director, Clark says she was able to incorporate her love of science in activities and day trips, such as "creeking" to collect fresh frog eggs and examining specimens under the microscope.

Asked what she enjoys most about the work, she says: "I love getting to know these wonderful children and celebrate their differences and interests. ... Watching their caring friendships evolve and their tremendous creativity is a gift that I feel fortunate to witness!" *

Table for One

This is my first ISCA restaurant review and I had planned on looking at a new restaurant. But one evening in November, after parking my car in the Wayne Avenue Garage in downtown Silver Spring, the delightful odors coming out of Bete Ethiopian Cuisine and Café proved irresistible.

Bete is located in that quaint little house next to the Montgomery County liquor store that fortunately was not rezoned during the last makeover of downtown. The homey atmosphere immediately strikes one as you walk through the door. Being a single diner, I opted for the smaller "bar" area where CNN was playing on the wide screen TV. When my meal came — the vegetarian combination platter, with an additional order of chicken wot — my full attention turned to the beautiful presentation in front of me.



The meal consisted of the traditional, tender, slow-cooked vegetables, which included yellow and green lentils, yams, green peas, collards — all

covered in their own savory sauces. The chicken wot (shown in the middle in the photo provided) was spicy and rich with the most delicate, juicy chicken I have ever eaten. Ample injera (the traditional Ethiopian pancake bread) was provided to dredge through any combination my heart desired.

Overall it was sweet, savory, spicy and appropriately rich throughout. A small green salad that was lightly dressed provided a lovely palate cleanser for the meal.

With an Ethiopian beer, the dinner came to \$32.00, mostly due to my own extravagance in wanting to try both the vegetarian sampler and a meat option. This meal was easily enough for two to three people, and the leftovers from my meal ended up as dinner for my husband. *****


